Targeted treatment

Imagine having a precision-strike weapon in the war against cancer that better targets cancerous tumors without risking the healthy cells and tissue around them.

Stop imagining.

With the recent arrival of the second of two new linear accelerators added over the past couple years and the upcoming implementation of additional technology utilizing those accelerators, the Adena Cancer Center has a leg up in the fight.


A linear accelerator uses pinpoint accuracy to direct radiation beams at cancerous tumors, which helps prevent damage to surrounding healthy cells and tissue and limits some of the side effects of traditional radiation therapy. It also can utilize real-time imaging while treatment is taking place, allowing the machine to pause, realign, and then resume the session if it detects tumor movement beyond a pre-set level in order to ensure the tumor is being targeted.

"With the accelerators, sessions are faster for patients, so treatment times are less, and they are better for our staff and our therapists because they are part of a better integrated system," says Gregory Thompson, MD, radiation oncologist. With both linear accelerators now in place, additional technology can now be integrated into the system to allow for a phased-in expansion of additional cancer-related services. Among them will be a procedure that can better protect the heart during radiation treatments for left-sided breast cancer patients and another that uses advanced software technology to precisely guide radiation to areas of the body that may see tumor movement during breathing.

The result is further enhancement of the safe, quality cancer treatment offered close to home that patients have come to expect from Adena Cancer Center. That's important because the Ohio Department of Health's 2023 annual cancer report reveals that several counties across south central Ohio rank among the highest in the state for incidences of cancer.

Adena Health is the only facility in southern Ohio to offer two linear accelerators and accompanying technology to combat those numbers, making the cancer center a destination for advanced radiotherapy care, says William "Alex" Wilson, MDF, medical director of oncology at Adena.

Catching lung cancer early

Never smoking or quitting smoking have been proven to reduce the incidence of lung cancer, but the greatest chance to survive lung cancer is by catching it early. This can be accomplished with a simple lung cancer screening.

Adena Cancer Center began offering its free lung cancer screenings in 2013 and since has become a national model for excellence - and is saving lives.

"If we find it early enough, we could save your life," says Felisha Hauswirth, BSN, RN, lung health specialist at Adena Health and head of Adena's lung cancer screening program.

Many people may not experience symptoms linked to lung cancer, especially in the early stages. This is why a lung cancer screening is so important. The no-cost lung cancer screening is a simple, painless, low dose, non-invasive CT scan that can identify tumors or lesions potentially needing further medical attention.

"If we find something early enough, there is a high possibility that it can be removed with surgery before it spreads to other parts of the body—and there's no need for further chemo or radiation treatments," she says.

While other health care organizations offer lung cancer CT screenings as well, the majority of

them bill insurance or, at minimum, require a copay from patients. Adena decided at the onset of its lung cancer screening program to offer the screenings for free in order to better serve its patients regardless of insurance status.

Individuals eligible for the free lung cancer screening are:

- Between 50-80 years old
- Have a history of smoking at least one pack a day for 20 years, or at least two packs a day for 10 years
- Are a current smoker, or someone who has guit smoking in the past 15 years

If you or a loved one meet these criteria, consider setting up a free lung cancer screening with Adena.

When patients join the lung cancer screening program at Adena, they receive one-on-one support from staff, helpful resources on preventing lung cancer, and annual screening reminders.

Not necessarily. In some cases, prescription medication or injections may control the pain and address the problem without surgery," Dr. Patel explains. "At Adena Health, prior to considering joint surgery, attempts are made to address other possible contributing health conditions such as weight, diabetes, heart, kidney and lung issues. This ensure patients are in good health before any surgery and also sees if addressing those issues reduces inflammation and eliminates the need for surgery."

"The time for surgery is when patients tell me it's time," he says. "Often times, that ends up being the point that, like it was with Cheryl, when the patient can't get through a day without thinking about the pain making even simple tasks difficult
