## Al helps flag cancer risk

Genetic testing helps identify hereditary cancers



Thanks to advancements in technology—and a simple text—Adena Cancer Center is helping patients receive more customized cancer care and even helping their families understand their risks.

After initial diagnosis, new cancer patients at Adena receive a text message asking them to complete a family health history. It sounds simple, but thanks to a genetics counseling partnership, that information goes through an analysis, powered by artificial intelligence, which identifies if the patient is at risk for genetic mutations that could benefit from further genetic testing. This technology not only helps expedite testing, but has allowed Adena to provide genetic testing to more qualified patients—nearly twice the national average.

"The portal flags patients and tells us right then and there who should get genetic testing," says Angie Smith, BSN, RN, an oncology nurse navigator and genetic counseling coordinator. "The old system required human review, so it was much slower and more patients were missed."

Although the patient being screened has already been diagnosed with cancer, genetic testing is important because it can help providers develop a more personalized treatment plan, Angie says.

This analysis can also alert family members that they might be carrying the genetic mutation as well. Adena will provide free genetic testing to a patient's parents, siblings, and children. Often, carrying a genetic mutation increases the risk of some cancers, which means individuals may benefit from earlier and/or more frequent screenings or take steps to help prevent developing cancer.

If the person qualifies for genetic testing, most insurances pay without requiring a co-payment by the patient.

This technology is just one way Adena Cancer Center's innovative patient-centered care ensures patients receive the best possible support and treatment from diagnosis to survivorship.

# Towe my life to Adena'



Barbara Rasmussen wasn't aware of the danger she was in when, after undergoing a stress test in preparation for a scheduled surgery, she received a phone call informing her that a cardiologist wanted to see her the next morning.

She wasn't sure what it could be about, having not experienced any pain, fatigue, or other symptoms of a possible heart-related condition.

That's when Adena Health cardiologist Hafeez Hassan, MD, explained to her that something unexpected had turned up in her stress test and she need to undergo a catheterization to get a closer look at the vessels leading to the heart.

The procedure revealed the main artery to her heart – an artery often referred to as a widowmaker – was almost completely blocked and was collapsing. As the result of that discovery, Dr. Hassan was able to place a stent to open up the artery back up and strengthen blood flow to the heart.

Barbara got a better sense of just how precarious her situation had been when she went in for her six-month post-procedure checkup. She asked to see the images of what her artery looked like at the time of the surgery and she saw it appeared flat.

"I thought, wow, what a miracle, they told me that they didn't even know how I had been able to walk in to the hospital," Barbara remembered, then referencing the church-based origins of Adena Health's founding. "I told him that I know this is a Christian place and this is my favorite place to go for care. My doctor is here, my specialists are here, and I know God is here in this hospital because He's the one who brings patients to the hospital who really need the service. Just look at me, I had a widowmaker and didn't even know it."

Barbara now tells everyone that she owes her life to Adena.



I tell them they should be glad they have a facility that's this close to home and this good," the 72-year-old Chillicothe resident says. "I love my care team at Adena. To be saved from a widowmaker? That's a miracle."
